

Blessing of Quilt Ministry on May 11, 2025

The Eksjo Quilting group has been busy cutting, sewing and tying quilts to provide comfort and warmth to children and adults throughout the world. This spring we were thrilled to have a group of students spend an afternoon with us learning to tie quilts. Together we tied 7 quilts in a few short hours. This intergenerational event was a fun experience for all that we plan to repeat in the fall.



On May 11th, finished quilts bound for Lutheran World Relief will be displayed in the sanctuary. During the service they will be prayed over and blessed. The following week the quilts will be boxed up and brought to the regional In - Gathering collection site in Fargo. From there they will be transported to St. Paul and then distributed by LWR to where they are needed most.

In 2024, 370,818 quilts were collected and distributed to 16 countries. Eksjo contributed 102 of those quilts in 2024 to LWR and gave 9 quilts to local recipients. Records show Eksjo has had an active quilting group since at least 1996. Please join us on May 11th as we celebrate our longtime commitment to help others though our quilting ministry with the blessing of the quilts followed by coffee and treats.

- 1. Bible Study at LPA
 - a. We meet on the first and third Friday mornings of the month before school.
 - i. Attendance was good (anywhere from 15 25 students attending regularly).
 - ii. Topics for last month: Self-Discipline, Selflessness, and Serving Others were the themes we discussed last month at our three meetings.
- 2. Pathways VBS which will be held at Eksjo the second week of July.
 - a. All churches are now on board. I will send the down payment check of \$500 this week.
 - b. Housing for councilors fell through. We decided to just get two rooms booked at the hotel in Hawley for Monday - Wednesday nights and provide them with gift certificates for lunch meals. The hotel will supply breakfast, we will provide supper during VBS, so the only meal they will be on their own for is lunch.
 - c. This will be an added cost of about \$250 \$300 per church but does not put the burden on a family to house 4 college students for 3 nights and gives the councilors a little more independence. I think it is well worth the cost.
- 3. March 23: Rend Collective concert in Fargo.
 - a. 30 tickets purchased (22 kids, 8 parents).
 - b. What an AMAZING experience! The kids had a blast! I hope everyone had a chance to see some of the pictures and videos posted on Facebook.
- 4. March 30th Bowling at Voyager Lanes with our 3 other church partners.
 - a. 36 people participated in bowling for two hours. It was great family fun!
- 5. Meals during Lent.
 - a. The confirmation class served the meals before every Lenten service on Wednesday nights this year. We took care of the bread and drinks, while congregational members signed up to bring soups and side dishes. Thank you to all who brought food and attended worship on Wednesdays. I think this is a must do every Lent.
- 6. Palm Sunday program and breakfast.
 - a. A huge thank you to **Bobbie** and **Jean Olson** for all that they did to make the program so wonderful this year! It was a special year thank you to **Janee** for bringing Ernie the Donkey, so a shoutout and round of applause to her as well for all her preparation and help!
 - b. Pancakes, sausage, and fruit were served after the service/program. The basement was full of hustle and bustle, it was a great sight to see and sound to hear!

- 7. Family Movie Night.
 - a. Wednesday night during Holy Week, we held a movie night that was fun for the entire family. We showed The Last Supper which told us the story of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and took us up to his resurrection. Candy and drinks were provided at no charge to those who attended. I counted 66 people in attendance.
 - i. This will be done again throughout the summer for area youth. However, probably done in the church basement to allow for popcorn and soda to be served.
- 8. Seder Meal Thursday night of Holy Week
 - b. 52 people attended the basement Seder Meal. We learned a little about the Jewish Passover meal and traditions, while enjoying friendly fellowship with one another. Nine youth attended the meal.
- 9. Confirmation classes begin back up Wednesday (April 23rd).
 - a. We have three classes left and will be wrapping up our "discipleship series" next week with our last class to be a fun competitive trivial night for the students.
- 10. Sunday School
 - a. Two more classes remaining for the year. Last day of Sunday school will be on May 4th.
- 11. May 4th Youth Group Picnic at Dunton Locks Park.
 - a. Grilling, Games, Troll hunting, hiking from noon 2:00 pm.
 - b. Open to students in 6th through 12th grade.
 - i. We invite this year's 6th graders so they can get a taste of what Youth Group is like as it will be available to them next year through their middle school and high school years.
- 12. May 18th I am planning a special project day for Sunday school students following church service.
 - a. Theme: Taking Care of God's Creatures...
 - i. Build bird houses, eat lunch together, watch an animal / bird animated movie together.
 - ii. Will have confirmation students help organize and facilitate.
